## **COVID-19 DDA Services**

Temporary changes, effective March 13, 2020, and Revised March 14, 2022

Respite is short-term care intended to provide both the family or the primary caregiver and the person with a break from their daily routines. Respite relieves families or the primary caregivers from their daily caregiving responsibilities

## **Service Delivery Flexibilities**

- May be provided in a variety of settings such as the person's home, family homes, and other community settings (Ends on June 30, 2022, unless otherwise authorized in the federally approved waiver and PCP)
- Respite Care Services can be used to replace Meaningful Day services while the participant's parent is not available (Ends on June 30, 2022)

## **Service Authorization Flexibilities**

 An additional up to 360 hours specifically related to the COVID - 19 emergency can be provided without prior authorization by the DDA (Ends on June 30, 2022)

Note: Respite Services are not available to people who are authorized to receive Community Living-Group Home, Supported Living, or Shared Living services
